The discussion of naming a Mayor Pro Tem was debated by council members and Mayor Bricker. Councilwoman, Chrystal Folse nominated Councilman Bill Cornman as

Mayor Pro Tem. Mayor Bricker nominated Councilwoman Julie Estlinbaum. Councilwoman Julie Estlinbaum thanked the Mayor for his nomination of her, but felt Councilman Bill Cornman should hold the position of Mayor Pro Tem. Councilman Bill Cornman was approved by vote as the new Mayor Pro Tem. Motion was made by Councilwoman Chyrstal Folse and seconded by Councilwoman Julie Estlinbaum. Motion passed unanimously.

## 4. RFP

DISCUSS, CONSIDER AND/OR APPROVE AWARDING THE BID FOR GROUP BENEFIT CONSULTANT SERVICES TO ONE OF SIX BIDDERS WHO SUBMITTED BIDS WITH CONTRACT PRICES RANGING FROM \$30,000 TO \$45,000, AND AUTHORIZE THE MAYOR TO EXECUTE A CONTRACT APPROVED TO FORM BY THE CITY ATTORNEY.

Rhonda Clegg, Director of Human Resources

Human Resources Director, Rhonda Clegg presented her findings to the Council regarding the bids for benefits consulting services. She discussed the six bids, ranging in annual fees of \$30,000 to \$45,000. Finance Director Scotty Jones and Clegg reviewed the top three companies together and unanimously chose IPS as the counsulting services company they recommend to Council.

Councilman Jason Childers asked if the City could provide these services without a consulting company. Clegg indicated that this is a service that she is not trained to perform and most cities seek outside professionals for this type of service. Councilman Jason Childers recommended that Rhonda Clegg be trained to offer the City this service in the future.

Motion to approve IPS as the provider was made by Councilwoman Julie Estlinbaum and seconded by Councilwoman Chrystal Folse. Motion was approved unanimously.

#### 5. Report

DISCUSS, CONSIDER AND/OR APPROVE A POLICY TO INCENTIVIZE THE DEVELOPMENT OF PROPERTY ENCUMBERED BY CITY LIENS.

Dustin Hodges gave information on the City's plan to create some form of an incentive to builders or developers that are seeking to develop vacant City lots that have numerous liens. If the liens are waived, the developer would be able to build homes that are needed in specific target areas. A workshop will be planned to determine how this program can be created and implemented in the future.

## 6. Ordinance

James Mason, Airport Manager, addressed Mayor Bricker and the Councilmembers about the need to have this specific ordinance in place to protect the environment of the airport. Agriculture planes will be required to follow the ordinance which will have more control over chemicals being used on the airport site and how they are handled. A motion was made to approve the ordinance by Councilman Jason Childers and seconded by Councilwoman Chrystal Folse. Motion was approved unanimously.

#### 7. Resolution

DISCUSS, CONSIDER, AND/OR APPROVE A RESOLUTION APPROVING THE FORM OF THE AERIAL APPLICATOR OPERATING (CROP DUSTING) PERMIT.

The Council reviewed the Aerial Applicator permit, which has been newly created to support City Ordinance Chapter 18 (AVIATION).

A motion was made to approve the permit by Councilman Jason Childers and seconded by Councilwoman Julie Estlinbaum. The motion was unanimously approved.

John Kaler, Kaler Energy Corp. or Gilbert L. Winne, Jr, Winne Land & Minerals, Inc. Public Hearing was held to discuss the proposed drilling of an oil/gas well east of town by Kaler Energy. There were no public comments.

The application to drill an oil/gas well off of HWY 457 was discussed by Council and Kaler Energy representatives. City Assistant Attorney Cynthia Trevino, informed Council that Kaler Energy has made attempts to follow the new ordinace rules regarding oil and gas drilling, although they are not required to do so.

A motion was made by Councilman Jason Childers and seconded by Councilwoman Becca Sitz to approve the application. The motion passed unanimously.

#### 10. Ordinance

DISCUSS, CONSIDER, AND/OR APPROVE AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 62 OF THE BAY CITY CODE OF ORDINANCES REGARDING OIL AND GAS WELLS.

The Oil and Gas Ordinance was discussed with Council by Public Works Director, Barry Calhoun. The current ordinance is out dated and working with City Attorneys, the Ordinance has been updated to establish more protection for the City.

A motion was made by Councilwoman Julie Estlinbaum and seconded by Councilman Jason Childers. The motion passed unanimously.

## 11. Ordinance
